Why call the Poison Center?

Call the Poison Center for questions or help if you think someone has been poisoned or taken too much medication, drugs or alcohol.

Talk to the experts. Don't waste time or risk getting bad information by searching online. All calls are private.

Signs that someone needs help:

- **Blue lips or fingers**
- **Choking, gurgling or snoring sounds**
- **Limp body**
- **No response when you yell their name or rub their chest hard**
- **Slow breathing**
- **Vomiting**



Don't wait - If someone has stopped breathing or is having seizures, call 911!
